- Please check your child's hair regularly for head lice and treat as soon as possible.

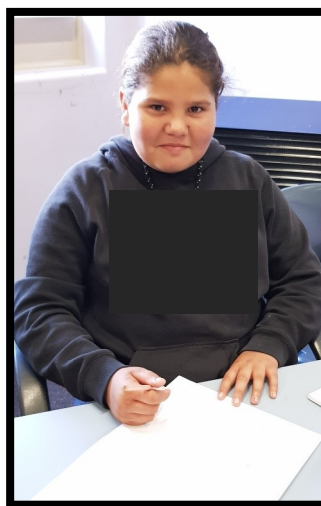
Class K/1G

In art, we drew some great pictures of kangaroos to go with our writing.

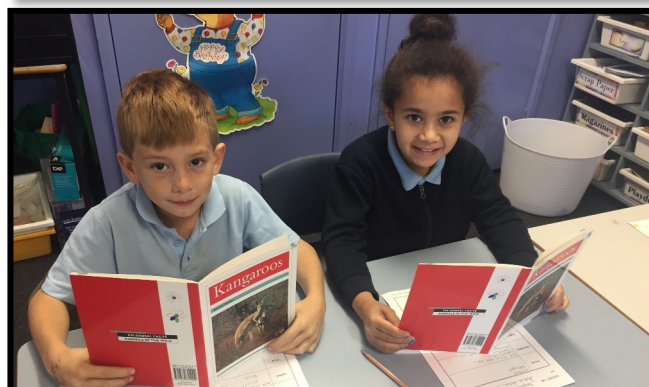
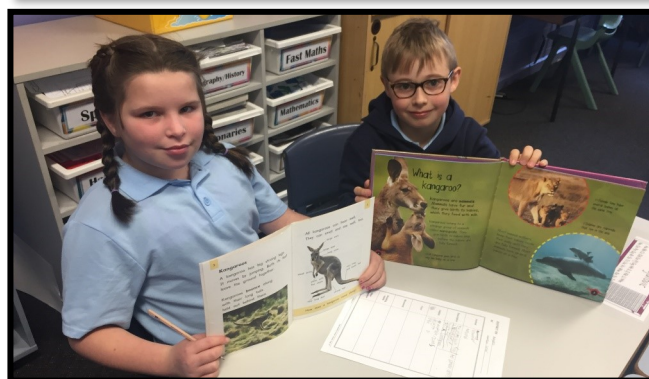
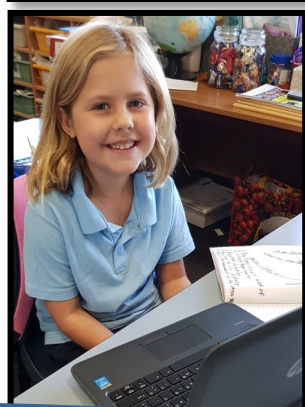
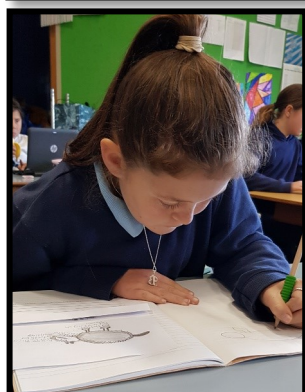
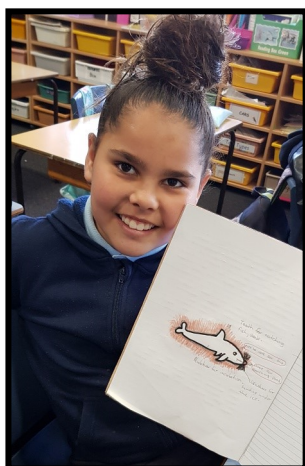

Visible Learning

At our Staff Development Day on Monday staff continued their Visible Learning journey. All teachers and support staff looked at *Learning Intentions*.

A Learning Intention describes what pupils should know, understand or be able to do by the end of the lesson.

Why Are Learning Intentions Important?

'If students are to take more responsibility for their own learning, then they need to know what they are going to learn, how they will recognise when they have succeeded and why they should learn it in the first place.'

Later this term, the staff will work on setting Success Criteria. Success Criteria are directly linked to the Learning Intention and summarise what the children should be able to do.

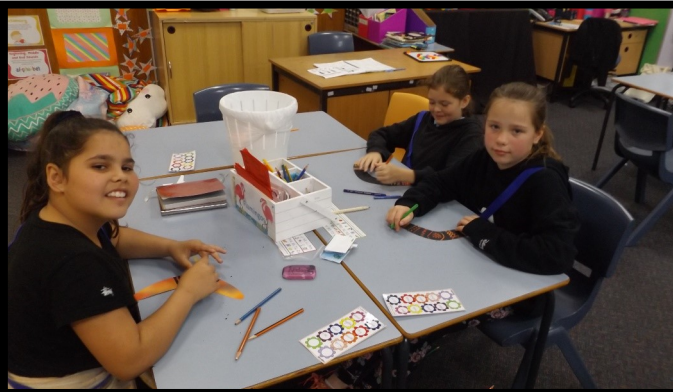
Below are our Learning Intention and Success Criteria for the session.

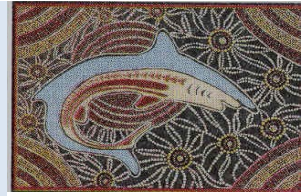

Don't open messages from people that you don't know. These could be nasty, contain viruses or be trying to sell you something.

Always keep your password a **secret**.

Tell your parents if you are upset by language, pictures or anything **scary** on the internet.

If someone is nasty, offensive or makes you uncomfortable in a chat room, don't respond and leave straight away.

Think before you post information online—once posted it's difficult to remove.

Don't accept any offers that seem too good to be true—they probably are.

Ask your parents before you give anyone on the internet your name, address or **any** personal details.
